Pastor's Letter

Zooming Out to Zoom In

We are already well into the season after Pentecost, so an operating description might be in order. As I was listening to David Wendall's recorded sermon this week (listening for sermon ideas, of course), he referred to the church calendar as a focus to where we are within the church year.

Our year starts with Advent in December, so it naturally points to Jesus coming into the world. Then Christmas marks his coming into the world, Epiphany marking the world's first reaction to it, etc. So up until Easter we are focused on the life of Jesus as he develops his leadership, authority and divinity. Then during Holy Week and Easter we remember how he died for us, and rose again, so that we will live, also, after we die. It is during this Easter season that we focus on the transformation of the faithful and how they react to Jesus' resurrection and eventual ascension into heaven. Maybe I should say we focus on how resurrected Jesus acts on his followers. In any case, it is Pentecost that marks when Jesus sends his Holy Spirit to rest upon and within his disciples, now sent as apostles to be his witnesses "in Jerusalem and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the end of the earth (Acts 1:8)." So ends the first half of the church year.

What this means is that we have half of the church year to respond with gratitude to the salvation God gave us in the death and resurrection of his own dear son. We can do this by using the fruit of the Holy Spirit, his power given to us as promised. We individually first receive this at our baptism, where the message of salvation in Christ sets us up to receive the Spirit's empowerment and enlightenment. His fruit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control (Gal 5:22). This is what we have available to us to share the good news of Jesus with our neighbors, including each other,
